Activity 1 - Science What types of plants and animals live in our local habitat?



Activity 2 – Science What is a force? What are pushes and pulls?

We were introduced to the terms 'push' and 'pull' and discussed what forces we could see happening in the school garden by our friends. We sorted some images into pushes and pulls.

Then we all had a turn to use the bow saw to experience pulling and pushing forces in action.





Activity 3 – D&T & Science

What is the best material for a boat?

We imagined we were Max from 'Where the Wild Things Are' and tried to use natural materials such as sticks and leaves to make a boat or raft. We joined our materials using grass and string and tested them in water to see if they floated.

Luckily all our rafts floated!



Activity 4 – Art How can we make art using nature?

We looked at some photos of artwork created by the artist Jackson Pollock and learnt about his style of painting.

We were inspired to create our own splatter paintings using natural materials like mud and mushed up berries. We have recreated a painting called 'Lilac Haze' and think it looks brilliant!
