Activity 1 - Science

How do we know if something is alive?

We found objects from the garden and sorted them based on whether they were alive, dead or had never been alive. We also used some pictures for other objects. We enjoyed discussing as a groups where some of the objects had come from!

Why do nettles sting?

Why do foxes come out at night?

Why are badger black and white?

We collected apples and blackberries from the garden and carefully cut them to make an fruit crumble. Throughout the day our crumble baked in the oven, It smelt delicious and had our stomachs rumbling!
