



**Sports Premium Funding** has been allocated to all Primary Schools to achieve self-sustaining improvements in the quality of P.E and sport in schools.

Sports funding is allocated based on the number of pupils within school. Stannington Infant School received £17,150 from the Department of Education to improve the quality of PE and sport for all children.

With this funding we aim to provide the following:

- Enhance the participation of all pupils in regular physical activity.
- Broaden experience of a range of sports and activities offered to pupils.
- Develop the confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport.
- Increase participation in competitive sport.

It is expected that schools will see an improvement against the following 5 key indicators:

- 1.The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity – kick-starting healthy active lifestyles.
- 2.The profile of PE and sport being raised across the school as a tool for whole school improvement.
- 3.Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport.
- 4.Broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils.
- 5.Increased participation in competitive sport.

This table reflects the breakdown of how the Primary PE and Sport Premium will be spent at Stannington, with details of anticipated impact.

CPD for all staff through specialist sports coaching and staff running sessions. We have newly appointed staff and staff that require refresher CPD sessions to support the teaching of the current PE schemes in school. Alongside our REAL PE scheme, we have bought a new PE scheme called REAL Gym to support the teaching of gymnastics, enabling the children to develop their agility, balance and co-ordination. All staff will need training in this scheme.	£985	All staff members who teach PE will have the confidence to lead and deliver sessions following our three schemes in school: REAL PE, REAL Gym and I-moves. As a result, children will participate in enriching and engaging PE lessons. The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity- Change4Life Clubs	£200	The children that tend to be inactive in sport activities will take part in our Change4Life clubs. This will enhance the children's confidence in water before KS2 when they will continue their swimming lessons	£2500	This will benefit Year 2 children in particular. The children will become more confident in water and they will become more knowledgeable around water safety. They will develop important skills, such as floating and it will provide a good starting point for when they continue their swimming lessons within KS2. Summer 2018. Significant improvement in all pupils swimming confidence, especially novice swimmers. All pupils had greater safety awareness.
Pupil mental health and well being Introduce a new PSHE scheme of work Jigsaw PSHE	£1275	Improve pupils emotional literacy to enabling them to articulate feelings including stress, anxiety, anger and how to cope with such emotions. Scheme of work in place. Staff very positive about the approach. Co-ordinator has observed sessions across school. Approach is very reflective and allows for quality pupil discussion.
The engagement of children during break times and lunch times will increase through the purchase of new playground markings.	£7796 (inc contribution from Parish council)	Improve children's engagement in activities during break times and lunch time. All staff and children to be trained in using the markings to ensure purposeful games and structure. Children are using the markings to play the games they have been shown and also to create their own games. There is clear evidence when observing lunchtimes and break times that children are more active and engaged.
