Transition Knowledge and Understanding of the world – History Geography Science RE Eco school	Why wouldn't you have a rubber towel or a glass shoe? In Science this half term 2F have been learning all about materials and their properties to help them answer questions like these. We ALL know the different materials that objects can be made from as well as some of the reasons why these materials are used. Ask us what flexible, tough or absorbent means! We have also sorted objects into those made from manmade OR natural materials. 2H have been lucky to do their Science learning this half term as part of Forest School. They have looked at animal habitats - where is the best place for a woodlice or a worm to live? Why? What does a badger live in? As well as forces - do you know what forces we use to fire an arrow into a target? Just ask 2H! In RE we have been discussing and learning about leaders and followers. We began by looking at our school grounds before moving onto thinking about our local area of Stannington. We enjoyed our fieldwork walk where we looked for human and physical features. We then went onto think about Sheffield and some of its famous landmarks before finally thinking about where Sheffield is in the United Kingdom. Ask me to show you our school on Google maps. In Science we have been thinking about animals and how they grow. We looked at what our basic needs are as humans and learned about the lifecycles of different animals.
