At Stannington Infant School we recognise the fact that parents are the children's 'first educators' and we acknowledge the vital role that parents and families play in a child's learning. Learning at home is an essential part of good education and impacts directly on your child's outcomes and sense of achievement, both in school and at home. We are keen for parents to engage in weekly home learning with their child as this motivates and supports children's learning.

If your child is in school



Listen to your child read as often as possible (minimum 3 times per week)



Complete the weekly spellings on Google Classroom



Complete the weekly Maths facts learning on Google Classroom



Complete the learning on Tapestry (EYFS)

In addition, you can practise handwriting, learn how to spell high frequency words, or learn phonic sounds. All the information you need is on the school website. Also look at the curriculum pages for power points on how to teach spelling and handwriting and to see our calculation policy.

If your child needs to isolate but is well enough to complete learning a pack of home learning will be emailed or posted to you.

If your child is isolating... If the class is required to self-isolate....

Online learning will be provided via Google classroom.

Families have been sent details of how to use this as weekly home learning is posted on here.

We will provide approximately 2½ hours' work each day, consisting of:

- Daily literacy learning (Google classroom)
- Daily maths learning (Google classroom)
- Daily phonics learning (Google classroom)
- Reading daily (Rising stars online library)
- 2-3 theme sessions over the week (History, Science, Geography, PSHE and RE)
- Daily Physical challenges (Google classroom)
- Stories to listen to (School website / Google classroom)

We will upload the daily learning every day for it to be completed by the end of each day, this is because each day's learning builds upon the previous day.
